DESCRIPTION OF INDICATOR	<p><i>Definition:</i> Infant mortality is defined as the number of infants dying in the first year of life in a calendar year per 1,000 live-born infants in the same year.</p> <p><i>Detailed methodological explanations:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – SORS, Statistical Yearbook of Slovenia. <p><i>International comparability:</i> comparable in principle, although approximations are sometimes used</p> <p><i>Manner of presentation:</i> aggregately for Slovenia</p> <p><i>Unit of measurement:</i> number of dead infants per 1,000 live-born infants</p>
SOURCE OF DATA FOR SLOVENIA	<p><i>Institution (publication):</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – SORS (Statistical Yearbook of Slovenia) <p><i>Frequency of publication:</i> annually (with a 2-year time lag)</p>
AVAILABLE TIME SERIES	from 1980 onwards (in older publications also for more distant past)
INTERNATIONAL COMPARISONS	– almost all world countries; <i>source:</i> WHO (Health for all database)
